•To support internationalization with the aim of improving the quality of science, education and training and youth field in the Republic of Croatia, in accordance with the needs of citizens, society and the economy.













### Mid-term evaluation of the Erasmus+ Programme

### How has Erasmus+ proven to be such a success?

- Frasmus+, the EU's flagship programme for education, training, youth and sport (2014-2020), has proved to be highly beneficial to the participants, not only in terms of supporting the transition to employment but also by creating a feeling of being an EU citizen.
- > Evidence shows that Erasmus+ is more coherent, relevant and partly more efficient and simpler than its predecessors.
- As regards the future of Erasmus+, the evaluation makes a clear case for a stronger investment in education and training with a new emphasis on the younger generations and the most vulnerable groups.


